About the Colville Tribes:

Today, more than 9,234 descendants of 12 aboriginal tribes of Indians are enrolled in the Confederated Tribes of the Colville. The twelve tribes which compose the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation include: ščəlámxəx^w (deep water) or Chelan; walwama (Wallowa people) or Chief Joseph Band of Nez Perce; sx̄wyʔilp (sharp pointed trees) or Colville; šntìyátkwəxw (grass in the water) or Entiat; snSáyckst (speckled fish) or Lakes; mətxwu (blunt hills around a valley) or Methow; škwáxčənəxw (people living on the bank) or Moses-Columbia; nspilm (prairie) or Nespelem; uknaqin (seeing over the top) or Okanogan; palúšpam (people from Palouse) or Palus; sənpSwilx (grey mist as far as one can see) or San Poil, and šnpəšqwáwsəxw (people in between) or Wenatchi.
