Individuals Do Not Represent the Wenatchi Tribe or the

(Nespelem, WA)—Several individuals have purported to represent the interests of the Wenatchi Tribe. These individuals have held themselves out in public as representatives of the Wenatchi Tribe, including in several news articles. The Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation wishes to clarify that these individuals are not acting on behalf of the Colville Tribes or of the Wenatchi Tribe.

Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation

Specifically, the Colville Tribes is not currently affiliated with any fundraising efforts to buy back land in its traditional territories. These fundraisers are being held by individuals who do not have authority to act on behalf of the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation or its constituent tribes, including the Wenatchi Tribe.

About the Colville Tribes:

Today, more than 9,448 descendants of 12 aboriginal tribes of Indians are enrolled in the Confederated Tribes of the Colville. The twelve tribes which compose the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation include: ščəlámxəx^w (deep water) or Chelan; walwama (Wallowa people) or Chief Joseph Band of Nez Perce; sx̄wyʔiłp (sharp pointed trees) or Colville; šntiyatkwəxw (grass in the water) or Entiat; snSayckst (speckled fish) or Lakes; mətxwu (blunt hills around a valley) or Methow; škwaxcənəxw (people living on the bank) or Moses-Columbia; nspilm (prairie) or Nespelem; uknaqin (seeing over the top) or Okanogan; palúšpam (people from Palouse) or Palus; sənpSwilx (grey mist as far as one can see) or San Poil, and šnpəšqwawsəxw (people in between) or Wenatchi.
