The Colville Tribes Mourns the Passing of Jeanne A. Jerred

(Nespelem, WA) — Jeanne A. Jerred passed away on July 5, 2022 at the age of 78 years old. A dinner and a rosary in her honor are scheduled for July 10 at 7 p.m. at the Keller Community Center. Her funeral will be the next day, July 11 at 9 a.m. Jeanne is survived by three daughters and her grandchildren.

Jeanne served her people with 16 total years on the Colville Business Council, including as Chairwoman of the Colville Tribes. During her time on CBC, Jeanne helped to achieve the Salazar settlement for the Colville people. She was exceptionally dedicated to advancing the cause of the Arrow Lakes people. Jeanne lobbied for the Keller ferry and ultimately christened the ferry to launch it.

Andy Joseph, Jr., Chairman of the Colville Tribes, said, "A loss of an elder is always a tragedy. That is especially true of an elder such as Jeanne Jerred, who did so much work on behalf of our people. I ask everyone to keep her and her family in their thoughts during this time of mourning."

About the Colville Tribes:

Today, more than 9,345 descendants of 12 aboriginal tribes of Indians are enrolled in the Confederated Tribes of the Colville. The twelve tribes which compose the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation include: ščəlámxəx^w (deep water) or Chelan; walwama (Wallowa people) or Chief Joseph Band of Nez Perce; sžwy?iłp (sharp pointed trees) or Colville; šntìyátkwəxw (grass in the water) or Entiat; snfáyckst (speckled fish) or Lakes; mətxwu (blunt hills around a valley) or Methow; škwáxčənəxw (people living on the bank) or Moses-Columbia; nspilm (prairie) or Nespelem; uknaqin (seeing over the top) or Okanogan; palúšpam (people from Palouse) or Palus; sənpfwilx (grey mist as far as one can see) or San Poil, and šnpəšqwáwsəxw (people in between) or Wenatchi.
