	WHEREAS, the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation (CTCR) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe that governs a land base of 1.4 million acres, thereby meeting the criteria for COLT membership; and WHEREAS, the CTCR agrees to pay annual Dues to COLT for annual membership including voting rights, to come from CBC dues and fees budget line item 121.63001; and WHEREAS, the CTCR agrees to join the Coalition of Large Tribes and agrees and supports the purposes as outlined herein, but reserves the right to be fully informed of and affirmatively consent to any COLT communication or advocacy effort the identify or refer to the CTCR prior to the
